

EAT - DRINK - SHOP - EXPLORE

A traditional Market Town with historic character.

Visit the Wednesday Street Market, browse the independent shops, take a stroll along the Shropshire Union Canal and relax in the local cafes and pubs.













Market towns in north Shropshire set the scene for a trail of local flavours. Start at Oswestry with the CAMRA UK pub of the year, visit Ellesmere's vineyard and distillery, then head to Whitchurch's growing foodie scene. Market Drayton, the birthplace of gingerbread, completes the trail.

NORTH SHROPSHIRE

North Shropshire's industrial legacy includes the dramatic Pontcysyllte and Chirk Aqueducts, a World Heritage Site, leading to 19th–century canals perfect for walkers and wildlife watchers. Explore the meres and mosses of the rural landscape.

For a quirky day out, visit the British Ironwork Centre or Hawkstone Park's follies and grottos. This is North Shropshire, less known but equally fascinating.





SHREWSBURY

Shrewsbury, Shropshire's county town, sits in the heart of the county with cobbled streets, hidden alleys, and Tudor buildings. It's home to iconic independent shops and a vibrant nightlife.

Bordered by the River Severn, Quarry Park offers green space and hosts the famous Shrewsbury Flower Show and Food Festival.

Visit Charles Darwin's birthplace, Shrewsbury Castle, and the atmospheric Shrewsbury prison. Explore more of Shropshire's serene landscapes and historic sites. For a family–friendly day, visit National Trust's Attingham Park with its grand mansion and countryside walks (keep an eye out for the deer!).





It's easy to get around Shropshire once you arrive. Shropshire has 19 National Rail stations, including at Shrewsbury, Church Stretton, Ludlow, Gobowen, Telford, Wellington, Cosford and Whitchurch. These give us excellent links to London, Birmingham, Manchester and Cardiff.

Shropshire has National Express coach links from London, stopping in Shrewsbury and Telford. A comprehensive Shropshire bus network will take you to our towns and villages across the county. In summer special shuttle buses connect many of south Shropshire's most popular tourist spots.

Shropshire park and ride services are in Shrewsbury, Bridgnorth, Ludlow and Ironbridge giving you car-free access to our market towns.







Let your feet do the talking in Shropshire

Shropshire is one of England's least densely populated counties. It's a deeply rural part of the world. Encompassing verdant hills, ancient woodlands, windswept moorland and mysterious lakes, the scenery can be spectacular. A quarter of the county is covered by the Shropshire Hills Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, much of which is just as beautiful as our national parks.

Pretty much the whole of Shropshire is fantastic for walking. The countryside is criss-crossed with nearly 3500 miles of footpaths, bridleways and byways, and there are also several long-distance walking routes to throw into the mix. The 200-mile-long Shropshire Way spreads in a figure of eight loop over the county. Some 28 miles of Offa's Dyke Path National Trail passes through Shropshire.

AROUND SHROPSHIRE'S MARKETS

BISHOP'S CASTLE

Bishop's Castle Town Hall hosts a flea market on the first Saturday of the month, and a farmers' market on the third Saturday.

BRIDGNORTH

Bridgnorth holds a market along the high street and beneath the Town Hall on Fridays and Saturdays. A speciality Sunday market takes place twice a month from March to December.

LUDLOW

Ludlow holds daily markets in Castle Square (apart from Tuesdays), with a farmers' market on Thursdays.

MARKET DRAYTON

This ancient market town has a street market every Wednesday, an indoor market open Wednesdays and Saturdays and an artisan market the second Saturday of every month.

MUCH WENLOCK
